## A Beautiful Site

**Fairview Lake YMCA** sits on mile-long Fairview Lake in Northwestern New Jersey. Our 660 acres adjoin the Delaware Water Gap National Recreation Area, providing access to the Appalachian Trail, the Delaware River, unlimited hiking possibilities and breathtaking views. Two waterfronts and a fleet of canoes, rowboats, kayaks, sailboats, and windsurfers offer a wide variety of waterfront activities.

## Our Excellent Staff

**Fairview Lake YMCA Staff** is committed to providing a positive experience for each and every camper. Our leadership team has over 140 years of professional camping experience. Our summer staff is selected with great care, to ensure that we have a diverse group of skilled and responsible counselors who care about children. Many are college students pursuing careers in education or other social service fields. Before the first campers arrive, the entire staff participates in intensive training, which focuses on safety, counseling techniques such as conflict resolution and values clarification, teaching, and camp policies and procedures. Our insistence on the highest standards ensures that we can keep our promise of a fun, high quality experience for our campers.

## Our Outstanding Facilities

**Fairview Lake YMCA** has three athletic fields for soccer, softball and other field sports, two basketball courts, two tennis courts, a hockey court for in-line skaters, a sand volleyball court, archery ranges, low and high ropes courses, a giant swing and outdoor climbing walls. Campers live in cabins that are clean and well maintained, with screened windows, built-in bunks and storage areas, electricity, flush toilets, hot showers, and smoke/carbon monoxide detectors. (**ETC, CIT, Arts and Hearts, and Trails and Tales** campers stay in seasonal cabins - unadorned shelters with amenities nearby in a central bathhouse.) Everything is provided to make campers comfortable and happy in a beautiful and scenic setting.

# TRADITIONAL CAMP LIFE

## Traditional Camp Program for a well rounded camp experience

**Minisink** - Coed, entering grades 2 - 4.  
(1 or 2 week sessions or combine them for a longer stay).

(1 week)

July 1 - July 7 or July 22 - July 28, 2012

(2 weeks)

July 8 - July 21 or July 29 - August 11, 2012



**Minisink** is the perfect experience for our younger campers. **Minisink** staff provide a nurturing environment for campers to live and play. Counselors ensure that their campers are taking care of their personal needs, brushing their teeth and making their beds. At the same time they make camp fun and exciting, encouraging campers to try new activities, and learn new skills. The **Minisink** campers' program provides a balance of structured and choice activities. Each camper participates in swim instruction, cabin and unit activities plus two elected periods daily. The afternoon concludes with the campers electing to participate in a recreational swim or heading to the athletic field for sports.

While **Minisink** campers receive the individual attention they need, they also enjoy participating in all camp activities and meals with the older **Laurel Ridge** and **Kittatinny** campers. This is perfect when siblings attend camp together and also makes for a smooth transition into **Laurel Ridge** and **Kittatinny** as the campers get older.

**Laurel Ridge** - Girls, entering grades 5 - 10.

**Kittatinny** - Boys, entering grades 5 - 10.

(3 weeks)

July 1 - July 21 or July 22 - August 11, 2012

(Campers may combine two sessions for a six week experience and stay at Fairview Lake July 21 - July 22 for a "changeover weekend").

**Laurel Ridge** and **Kittatinny** campers have the opportunity to custom design their program each week by signing up for three elected activities. In addition, there is one period for swim lessons and another when campers elect to go swimming or go to the athletic field and court area to play a sport of their choosing. Cabin mates will also enjoy something different during morning and evening activity periods - before and after normal activity time. Believe it or not there is still time for "siesta" right after lunch when everyone has a little quiet time to read a book, write home, hang out with friends or visit the Trading Post.



Fairview Lake has long standing traditions, including Unit Pride Day.

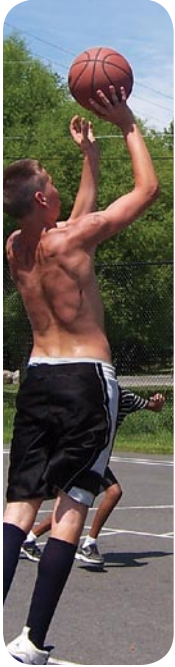

We want you to experience the joy of your surroundings, the satisfaction of meeting new challenges and the discovery of very special friendships. An experienced, responsible staff member, who is at least 21 years old, leads each trip with at least one other staff member. Campers use Fairview Lake Camps as a home base, staying in our seasonal, unadorned cabins with a central bathhouse and pavilion very close by. While on the trail or on the river, everyone sleeps in tents. Expect to work hard supporting each other, pushing limits, reaching new heights and discovering a new you!

## Adventurer's Sampling

Coed entering grades 6 - 11. July 8 - 21 or July 29 - August 11, 2012 (2 Weeks)

**Focus:** 3 day/2 night canoe trip on Delaware River, 3 day/2 night backpack trip on Appalachian Trail, outdoor camping and cooking, a day rock climbing and a day rappelling.

## Angler's Catch

Coed entering grades 6 - 11. June 24 - June 30 or August 11 - 17, 2012 (1 Week)

**Focus:** freshwater fishing basics.

## Bees, Boats & Bobbers

Coed entering grades 6 - 11. July 1 - July 7 or July 22 - 28, 2012 (1 Week)

**Focus:** hiking, ultimate frisbee, freshwater fishing and a day trip for deep sea fishing. Campers cook their deep sea catch for the next day's lunch.

Coed entering grades 6 - 11. July 1 - July 7, 2012 (1 Week)

**Focus:** backpacking, canoeing, tent camping and outdoor cooking.

## Delaware Safari

Coed entering grades 8 - 11. June 24 - 30, 2012 (1 Week)

**Focus:** canoeing, outdoor camping and cooking.

## E.T.C. Service Corps

Coed entering grades 8 - 11. July 8 - 21, 2012 (2 Weeks)

**Focus:** value of performing varied service projects. Campers can receive volunteers hours for participation in this program.

## E.T.C. Extreme Challenge

**Coed entering grades 7 – 11. July 22 – August 11, 2012 (3 Weeks)**

**Focus:** backpacking on the Appalachian Trail, camping trip to Whitewater Challengers to include: kayak trip, mountain bike, zip line, rappelling, rafting and waterskiing and a group service project.

**Focus:** 4 day/3 night backpack trip on Appalachian Trail, 4 day/3 night canoe trip on Delaware River, day of climbing wall and high ropes, outdoor camping and cooking.

**Coed entering grades 4 – 8. July 1 – 7, July 22 – 28, 2012 (1 Week)**

**Focus:** backpacking, hiking, climbing wall, outdoor camping and cooking. Great for first timers.

## Navigating Nature

**Coed entering grades 4 – 8. June 24 – 30 or July 29 – August 4, 2012 (1 Week)**

**Focus:** map and compass use, shelter building, fire building, plant identification, outdoor cooking.

## Outdoor Discovery

**Coed entering grades 4 – 8. July 8 – 14 or August 11 – 17, 2012 (1 Week)**

**Focus:** exploring the natural world and local habitats - from aquatic studies to astronomy, light hiking, boating.

**Focus:** rock climbing, backpacking, tent camping, and outdoor cooking.

# SPECIALTY CAMPS: We have a camp for everyone!

## Action-Reaction

**Coed, Grades 4 - 10.**  
**June 24 - June 30 or**  
**August 11 - 17, 2012**

Action-Reaction combines traditional camp activities with daily activities focusing on things that fly. Specialized activities such as building and launching model rockets, hydro rockets, driving eco-friendly golf balls into the lake and water balloon launchers will highlight each day.



## Rookies Weeks

**Coed, Grades 2 - 10.**  
**June 24 - June 30 or August 11 - 17, 2012**

Rookies Week is a great introduction to summer camp. The decision to try sleepaway camp brings with it many questions like: What will the food be like? Who will my cabin mates and counselors be? What will happen if I don't feel well? Will I miss home? This week is for you - a short period of time to get a taste of sleepaway camp and to see if you like the experience. Campers will have the opportunity to select activities from an array of camp programs throughout the week.

## Creative Arts Camp

**Coed, Grades 4 - 8.**  
**June 24 - June 30 or August 11 - 17, 2012**

A full week of fun for budding artists in both the performing and visual arts in a comfortable, non-competitive environment. Activities include: drama, improvisation, drawing, dance, voice, creative writing and guitar. Campers select their own schedule for the week, and may explore several different programs. Recreation time and all-camp activities will supplement your arts program.

## Arts and Hearts

**Girls, Grades 4 - 7.**

**June 24 - June 30, 2012**

Girls will focus on what it means to become strong women, with opportunities to learn about and from positive female role models. The week is filled with an assortment of arts such as poetry, drama and music - combined with team building, fitness, a talent show and workshops about nutrition and building self-confidence. Activities include archery, swimming, boating and the challenging climbing wall. Campers live in our seasonal camping area in unadorned cabins with amenities nearby in a central bath house.



## Trails and Tales

**Boys, Grades 4 - 7.**

**June 24 - June 30, 2012**

A week in an environment where boys enjoy the natural world. Campers learn about ecology and astronomy while sharpening team building and survival skills. Boys learn to express themselves through storytelling, writing and drawing. Days are packed with non-competitive activities such as canoeing, archery, fishing, swimming and hiking. Campers live in our seasonal camping area - in unadorned cabins with amenities nearby in a central bathhouse. This is the ideal setting for boys to grow mentally, physically, and creatively.

## Sailing/Windsurfing Camp

**Coed, Grades 4 - 10.**

**June 24 - June 30 or August 11 - 17, 2012**

Campers learn sailing skills and proper terminology to become proficient sailors.

Campers use two beginner boats - Sunfish and Lasers, or try windsurfing! A sailing regatta marks a fitting end to a great week!

Sailing and windsurfing are taught by qualified instructors.



# RANCH CAMP

**One-Week Program, Grades 4 – 10.**

**Coed, June 24 – June 30, 2012**

**Girls, July 1 – 7 or July 22 – 28, 2012.**

Our riding program is the summer home to 31 horses carefully selected for riders of all ages and abilities. We offer instruction for beginners through advanced led by skilled riding instructors from a wide selection of disciplines. Each "Ranch Hand" will be assigned a horse and taught how to take care of it throughout the week. Each day campers will saddle up for expert ring lessons and exciting trail rides throughout our extensive 600+ acres of forests and trails. Throughout the week campers will also have opportunities to go swimming and participate in traditional camp activities in the evenings. At the end of the week campers will participate in a Rodeo giving them a chance to demonstrate what they've learned during the week. Our Riding Director is an ACA approved Certified Riding Instructor.

**Two-Week Program, Grades 4 – 10.**

**Girls, July 8 – 21 or July 29 – August 11, 2012**

Includes many of the same lessons as the one-week program plus so much more. The emphasis is on advancing your abilities as a rider. Campers will increase their knowledge of horses and learn basic animal care – recognizing common diseases, reading vital signs, and administering basic first aid. They will also have the opportunity to go on an overnight trail ride on the shores of Fairview Lake. August campers attend the nationally famous Sussex County Farm & Horse Show.

## DEPOSITS AND REFUNDS:

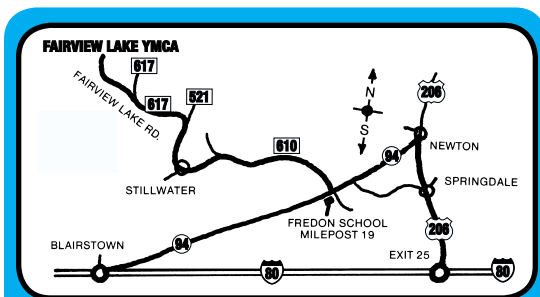

## FAIRVIEW LAKE YMCA CAMPS AGREEMENT WITH CAMPER'S PARENTS

**MEMBERSHIP** - All campers must be members of the Metro YMCAs of the Oranges, or a participating Y while at camp. At the time of registration, non-members become a Fairview Lake YMCA Summer Youth Member.

**DEPOSIT REQUIREMENTS** - \$50 membership fee (if applicable) PLUS \$500 for each two or three week session. One week programs, including ETC, \$50 membership plus \$250 deposit. This fee is applied to the total tuition bill. It will not be refunded for any reason.

**REFUND POLICY** - Deposit fees are non-refundable. Entire camp fees are also non-refundable if a camper leaves due to homesickness, dismissal or voluntary withdrawal. Fees paid over and above the deposit are refundable ONLY if cancellation is made at least 30 days prior to the start of camp session. If it is deemed advisable to send a camper home for an **EXTENDED** period, for medical reasons, one half of the unexpired portion of the session will be refunded.

Our camps are for those who enjoy camping. Rules for acceptance and participation in the program are the same for everyone without regard to race, color, national origin, sex, age and disability. It is understood that all campers will be treated as individuals and respect shown for reasonable differences in tastes, preferences, abilities, and range of behavior patterns. The Y reserves the right to dismiss a child from camp whose special needs we are not able to meet or whose conduct is not in the best interest of the total camp, without refund.
